Helsdon, John	Alborough	8 Apr 1839	Farmer	1778	Born at Suffield. Wife Mary. In 1851 he was at the Old Hall, Aldborough, farming 80 acres with 2 labourers.
Dolphin, Reverend John	Antingham	12 April 1836	Cleric & JP	1805	Born at Lower Slaughter, Gloucestershire. Appointed 1830 to Antingham with Thorpe Market. Married Mary Western 1833. Died 1889.
Coleman, John	Antingham	3 April 1837	Farmer	1786	Born at Bergh Apton. Wife Elizabeth (Betsy). At Rockland St. Mary in 1851 and Framingham Pigot (widowed) in 1861.
Barcham, Jedidiah	Antingham	27 Oct 1845	Farmer	1785	Born at Edingthorpe. 1841 - Antingham, farmer. 1851 - White Horse Common, North Walsham. Farmer of 150 acres, employing 7 men. Wife Susan born at Stalham. Died 1858.
Carter, James	Antingham	30 Apr 1849	Farmer	1806	Born at Northrepps. 1851 - Farmer of 428 acres employing 16 labourers. Unmarried. Living with his widowed sister Elizabeth.
Daniel(l)(s), Edward	Aylmerton	12 April 1836	Farmer	1810	Born at Norwich. "Daniell" in 1841 Census. In 1851 he was farming 360 acres and employed 12 men. Died 1896 at Norwich.
Woods, Robert	Aylmerton	9 Apr 1838	Farmer	1779	Born at Erpingham. Wife Hannah b. Erpingham 1785. 1841 - Aylmerton. Had moved to Thurgarton by early 1844, where he became a Guardian. 1851; farming 1400 acres with 64 labourers.
Mack, Thomas Bond	Baconsthorpe	20 April 1836	Farmer	1793	Born at Tunstead. Lived at Baconsthorpe Old Hall. In 1851 he was farming 295 acres, employing 10 men & 3 boys. Died 1856.
Denn(e)y, Richard	Baconsthorpe	10 April 1837	Farmer	1807	See 19 Jun 1837 re letter.
Windham, William Howe	Barningham Northwood	12 April 1836	Landowner	1802	Born at Westminster. Lord of the Manor of Barningham Norwood. Was a Whig MP in the early 1830s. Succeeded to the Felbrigg estate on the death of his father Vice-Admiral William Windham (formerly Lukin) in 1833. High Sheriff of Norfolk 1842. Father of William Frederick 'Mad' Windham. 22 Dec 1854 - <i>Died at his residence in Berkeley Square, Mr. William Howe Windham, of Felbrigg Hall. He was one of the representatives of the Eastern Division of Norfolk in 1832, when he was returned with the Hon. George Keppel, their opponents being Lord Henry Cholmondeley and Mr. Nathaniel Peach. In 1835 he came forward with Mr. R. H. Gurney, in opposition to Mr. Edmond Wodehouse and Lord Walpole, when the two last named were returned. In 1837 another election occurred, when Lord Walpole having retired, Mr. H. N. Burroughes was brought forward in conjunction with Mr. Wodehouse. Mr. Windham and Mr. Gurney, who opposed them, were again unsuccessful. Mr. Windham, who was a staunch Whig, was the oldest son of Vice-Admiral Windham (formerly Lukin), who took the name and arms in pursuance of the will of his uncle, the Right Hon. William Windham, in 1824, on succeeding to the estate on the death of Mrs. Windham. On the decease of his father, the Admiral, Mr. Windham succeeded to the Felbrigg property. He married, in 1835, Lady Sophia Hervey, daughter of the Marquis of Bristol, by whom he had one son, then in his fourteenth year. Mr. Windham died at the age of 53.</i>

Pearce, Robert	Barningham Winter	1 Dec 1845	Farmer	1788	Appointed 24 Nov 1845. 1851 - farming 160 acres with 5 men. Born at Guist. His wife Elizabeth was born at Wells.
Wrench, Henry	Beckham East	3 May 1836	Farmer	1788	Born at Morston. Wife Ann. Moved to Swafield (and resigned as Guardian) in October 1844 where, in 1851, he was farming 252 acres with 9 labourers. Died 1870.
Bird, George Jr.	Beckham East	16 Dec 1844	Farmer	1819	Born at Bodham. Married Sarah King (b. Fareham, Hants.) in 1838. 1841 - had 4 live-in farm servants. 1851 - farming 350 acres with 14 labourers.
Fuller, Cook	Beckham West	12 April 1836	Farmer	1796	Born at West Beckham. Unmarried. Enumerator of 1831 Census. Moved to Holt after retirement. Died 1884 Age 87.
Sayer(s), Samuel	Beckham West	2 Apr 1838	Auctioneer, brewer, and maltster	1800	Born at West Beckham. Wife Elizabeth b. Hickling. 1851 - farming 70 acres with 2 labourers.
Matsell, John King	Beckham West	8 Apr 1839	Farmer	1816	Wife Elizabeth (nee Hayhow).

Cremer, Reverend Cremer	Beeston Regis	18 Jul 1842	Clergyman	1795	Cremeres were formerly Woodrow & took the name and arms of Cremer 25 Nov 1785. Born 30 Jun 1795 at Cringleford, entered St John's College 21 Oct 1812, B.A. 1818, ordained a Deacon at Norwich 29 Nov 1818. Rector of Runtton with Aylmerton 1827-38, Rector of Felbrigg with Metton 1827-38, Rector of Beeston Regis 1837-67. Married Marianne Charlotte, daughter of George Wyndham of Cromer Hall on 22 Jul 1829 at Felbrigg. Died 6 May 1867 aged 71 at Beeston Regis.
Fuller, Samuel	Beeston Regis	17 April 1848	Farmer	1824	1851 - farming 186 acres with 8 labourers. Born at Itteringham. His wife Maria was born at Elsing.
Spurrell, John	Bessingham	12 April 1836	Landowner & Maltster	1779	Born at Bessingham & lived at Bessingham Manor. Died 1837. See Wikipedia entry for the Spurrells of Norfolk .
Spurrell, F.	Bessingham	28 Aug 1837	-	-	Spurious entry by Clerk?
Spurrell, Daniel	Bessingham	15 Jan 1838	Farmer	1817	Born at Bessingham; son of John Spurrell (below). 1851 - farming 250 acres with 12 labourers. Mistakenly listed against Beeston Regis on 30 Mar 1840.
Spurrell, John D.	Bessingham	19 Mar 1838	-	-	Spurious entry by Clerk?
Spurrell, W.	Bessingham	30 Dec 1839	-	-	Spurious entry by Clerk?
Bird, George	Bodham	12 April 1836	Farmer	1789	Born at Sheringham. Died at Bodham 1880 age 92.

Overton, Richard	Bodham	4 Apr 1842	Farmer	1785	1841 - Apparently unmarried, HoH living with housekeeper Maria Bird and (her husband?) Richard Bird.
Overton, G.	Bodham	See note	NK	NK	Only attended one meeting on 20 Nov 1837. Incorrect entry by Clerk?
Bird, Samuel	Bodham	19 May 1845	Farmer	1819	1851 - 'Lower part of Bodham' farming 274 acres with 10 men. Unmarried. Part of a family of farmers in Bodham.
Seeley, William Gladen	Bodham	24 April 1848	Farmer	1820	Appears in White's 1845 directory as 'William George.' 1851 - 'Upper part of Bodham' farming 250 acres with 10 labourers. Unmarried.
Hill, Josiah	Briston	12 April 1836	Farmer, breeder & valuer	1797	Born at Dereham. "Highly celebrated as a breeder and improver of Leicester rams" (White's 1845). In 1851 he was farming 1011 acres arable, 192 pasture, employing 41 men, 13 women & 15 boys.
Bond, Reverend Robert	Briston	2 Apr 1838	Curate	1804	Living at The Lawn, Briston in 1841. Wife Alice. Died at Briston 1847.
Ebbetts, John	Cley next the Sea	12 April 1836	Farmer.	1800	Born Norwich. Possible death in St. Faiths District 1850.
Lee, John	Cley next the Sea	26 Dec 1843	Merchant/Miller	1790	Came to Cley in 1820. 1841 - Merchant b. 1790, wife Hannah. Leased Cley Mill 1822-1848 and owned a house and 7 cottages in the village.
Upjohn, Edward	Cley next the Sea	17 April 1848	Farmer	1817	1851 - Newgate. Farming 202 acres with 7 labourers & 2 lads. Born at Field Dalling; wife Susanna born at Bodham.
Rust, John William	Cromer	12 April 1836	Grocer & draper - later farmer, Bank Agent & Proprietor	1799	Born at Cromer. Built the Westcliff Hotel (unconfirmed). Had a shop and stables in Tucker St. Provided a Board Room and Waiting Room for the Guardians from 1842 onwards. Died 1872. B. Rust on 16 Dec 1839.

Sandford, Henry	Cromer	3 April 1837	Coal Merchant & General Agent	1798	Born at Weybourne. Married Mary Watson Stephenson in 1823. Lived in Church Street (south side). Also farmed 20 acres (1851). Died 1875. Owned a coalyard and meadow on the corner of The Gangway and East St. He lived in a house called the Beeches opposite the Albion Hotel. Owned the coal ship "Commerce". "Jarrols of Norwich, Lloyds Bank and Dantetre House were built on the site of the house called 'The Beeches' and its garden, which ran from the house up to the G.P.O. The 'Beeches' belonged to Mr Henry Sandford, and the property, apart from this large frontage in Church Street, ran back to, what is now, Mount Street, and consisted of another garden at the rear of the house, stables, Coach House, Barn and Bullocks Yard. His son, W. George Sandford lived there with the Misses Sandford, and carried on the business. He was also Lloyds Agent, and the Hon. Secretary of the Local Branch of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution for many years. He first introduced Crab Pots into Cromer, having seen them in use on the South Coast, and brought one back with him. His business address was Mickleborough House in High Street. He married, and moved away to No. 5 Brunswick Crescent. After he moved away from 'The Beeches', his Uncle, Mr George Sandford, a Chemist from London, came to live there. In due course, Mr. W.G. Sandford married a second time, and then moved to Colne Lodge, in Loudon Road (now the site of the Telephone Exchange) until his death in 1898. Early in 1900 'The Beeches' was demolished. The last mention of the Sandfords is of a Miss Sandford as the sole occupant in 1899, after which she lived at Jetty Cottage until her death."
Ballachey, George Baker	Edgefield	3 May 1836	Lawyer (Ballachey & Son, Attornies)	1782	Solicitors & lawyers of Church Street Holt. Born at Oxford. Lawyer. '.... George Baker Ballachey, Esq., who has a handsome seat here, and is owner of The Mount, a lofty eminence, commanding a view of the sea and 30 churches' (Edgefield, White's Directory 1836). He had been active in Norfolk and London in relation to the agricultural depression and the enacting of the Poor Law, and instrumental in organizing a significant percentage of English emigrants to Canada in the 1830s from 16 parishes. Died 1857.

Temple, Robert	Edgefield	8 Jan 1844	Farmer	1805	Born at Bodham. Wife Sarah Ann b. 1811 Edgefield. 1841 - Gantt Lane, Edgefield. 1851 - farming 370 acres with 18 labourers.
Morrison, William	Edgefield	12 Apr 1847	Farmer	1817	Lived at the Green (1845 White's directory). 1851 - farming 92 acres with 3 labourers. Born Horstead. Wife Sarah born at Foxley.
Clark(e), John	Felbrigg	12 April 1836	Farmer	1787	Born at Aldbrough, Suffolk. In 1851 had 400 acres employing 12 labourers.
Beare, Edmund/Edward	Gimingham	12 April 1836	Farmer	1794	Born at Northrepps. Lived at Paston. In 1851 had 280 acres, employing 12 men and 5 boys. Died 1865. Rented land that was part of Gimingham workhouse property.
Rising, Robert	Gimingham	30 Mar 1840	Farmer	1785	Born at Paston. Wife Eliza. 1851 - farming 270 acres with 10 labourers. Died 1874 age 90. Took advantage of the manure generated at the Gimingham Workhouse and in 1843 rented spare land at the workhouse previously let to the Revd. Blakelock.
Helsdon, Charles	Gimingham	12 Apr 1847	Landed Proprietor	1811	Listed as a farmer in White's directory of 1845. 1851 - Upper Street. Born at Antingham; his wife Sarah born at Yarmouth.
Cook(e), William	Glandford cum Bayfield	5 Sep 1836	Miller	1789	Born at Hunworth. Of Mill House, Glandford. 'Miller employing 5 men' in 1851.
Scott, Jonathan Leman	Gresham	12 April 1836	Farmer	1811	Wife Janette born in 'foreign parts.' Died in the September quarter of 1844. Death reported to the Board 21 Oct 1844.
Mayes, Thomas	Gresham	3 April 1837	Farmer	1776	Born at Baconsthorpe. 1841 - Gresham, unmarried. 1851 - Baconsthorpe. Farmer of 120 acres, employing 4 labourers and 1 lad.
Scott, Abraham Leman	Gresham	2 Apr 1838	Farmer	1810	Born at Gresham. Wife Catherine. 1851 - farming 213 acres with 6 men, 1 boy and 1 girl.
Leman/Lemon, Barnabas	Gresham	9 Dec 1844	Farmer	1816	Born at Glandford. Wife Catharine, born Glandford. 1851 - farming 247 acres with 8 men, 3 boys & 2 girls.
Smith, Henry	Gunton	3 May 1836	Steward & Land Agent	1800	In 1841 was living at at Elderton Lodge, Gunton. Lord Suffield's Steward.
Press, Robert	Hanworth	12 April 1836	Farmer	1796	Born at Hanworth. In 1851 was farming 214 acres & employed 11 men. Died 1853.
Helsdon, Benjamin	Hanworth	2 Apr 1838	Farmer	1780	Born at Suffield. In 1851 he was farming 170 acres with 6 labourers.
Ling, Benjamin	Hempstead	12 April 1836	Farmer	1794	Born at Tunstall (Suffolk), Lived at Hempstead Hall. Farmer. In 1851 was farming 671 acres, employing 26 men, 9 boys and 10 women. Died 1862 at Hempstead. Appeared as 'W. Ling' on 28 Oct 1839. Reappeared as Guardian in 1843

King, Jeremiah William	Holt	8 Apr 1839	Landowner, Grocer	1777	Born at Holt. Married Elizabeth Hobbs 1808. Principal landowner. Postmaster. Premises in High Street incorporated the Post Office. By 1851 occupation was changed to farmer of 170 acres, employing 4 men.
Norton, Thomas	Holt	8 Apr 1839	Brewer & Farmer	1781	Of Church Street. Owned the White Lion 1835-1847 and the Feathers briefly a few years before. Died late 1850.
Harris, William	Holt	27 Mar 1843	Miller	1800	Wife Harriet. 1841 - Cley Road.
Withers, John Showell	Holt	1 Apr 1844	Maltster, Brewer & Auctioneer	1806	Born at Holt. Wife Amy born at Cromer. Auctioneer of Holt; see 12 Nov 1838. Sold the Holt Parish property. Surveyor of the Highways for the Parish of Holt. 1851 - Barmer Street, Holt.
Boyd, Thomas	Holt	21 May 1849	Miller	1823	Appears in 1851 on Norwich Road as Landed Proprietor, with brother Alexander additionally farming 636 acres with 20 men, 7 women & 6 lads. Both born at Pinner; Alexander in 1818 and Thomas in 1823.
Parke, William	Holt	22 Apr 1850	Innkeeper	1812	Became Guardian for Hunworth in April 1851. 1851 - Innkeeper of Market Place, Holt. Born East Dereham. Wife Elizabeth. At the Feathers 1844-1861.
Bid(e)well, Samuel	Hunworth	12 April 1836	Farmer	1781	Born at Weston Longville. 1841 Beck House; farmer. 1851 Farmer of 180 acres with 6 labourers. Died 1858 at Hunworth. Also appeared as 'Bidle.'
Nurse, Edm(o/u)nd	Kelling	12 April 1836	Corn Miller	1769	Born at Trimmingham. Built the Kelling Post mill c.1820. His son was also Edmund and it's probable that both of them represented the Parish at different times. The elder Edmund died 1845. Listed as W. Girdlestone, Revd. John Gay	Kelling	16 Apr 1849	Cleric	1815	Rector of Kelling and Salthouse. Born at Baconsthorpe. Wife Mary.
Coleman, Abraham	Knapton	10 April 1837	Farmer	1799	Born at Hardley. Wife Ellen. 1851 & 1861 occupied a farm of 217 acres. Reappeared as Guardian 1843. Died 1868.
Cook, Reverend Stephen J.	Knapton	12 April 1836	Cleric	1775	Born at Knapton. Vicar of Paston. Died 1861.
Cooper, James F. or James T. ?	Knapton	28 Mar 1842	Farmer	1801	Born at Knapton. Wife Susan born at Lowestoft. Appears as Farmer in 1841 and Ag. Lab. in 1851.
Atkinson, Charles	Knapton	9 Apr 1838	Farmer	1776	Appeared as 'H. Atkinson' on 18 Nov 1839. Born 1776 at Barton. Married Bridget Dew 1811. Retired and moved to North Elmham where he died in 1851 (buried at Swanton Novers).
Barnes, Reverend William Lawson	Knapton	21 Apr 1845	Cleric	1811	Started as Curate at Knapton in 1837. He resided at Charminster in Dorset. Born Samesbury, Lancashire. Wife Grace born at Lancaster. Not found in 1841 or 1851. Died 1895. Wrote "Poems of rural life in the Dorset dialect" see also "Select poems of William Barnes."
Hardy, William	Letheringsett	12 April 1836	Brewer	1770	William Hardy Sr. purchased the Hagen's Brewery and the Hall at Letheringsett in 1780 and they passed to William Hardy Jr. Became an ex-officio member in 1839. Died 1842.
Cozens, William Hardy	Letheringsett	9 Apr 1838	Magistrate, Brewer & Farmer	1807	Born at Sprowston. Nephew of William Hardy (above). Inherited his uncle's estate in 1842 and changed his name to William Cozens-Hardy. Wife Sarah. Farmed 500 acres, employing 28 labourers, 3 women & 8 boys (1851). Died 1895. Norfolk Chronicle 27 August 1842. Her Majesty has been pleased to grant unto William Hardy Cozens Esq. of Letheringsett, her Royal licence to take and use the surname and arms of Hardy, in addition to his present name, in compliance with a condition contained in the will of his late uncle William Hardy, Esq., of Letheringsett Hall.

Durrell, Joseph	North Walsham	12 April 1836	Corn Miller & shopkeeper	1800	Lived at Sidestrand. Died 1838.
Wortley, John	North Walsham	16 Apr 1838	Farmer	1806	Born at Sidestrand. Living near Bradfield Bridge on Bradfield Road. 1841 wife appears to be Eliza, but Matilda in 1851. Farming 431 acres with 14 men, 6 boys & 2 women in 1851.
Shep(e)rd, Martin James	North Walsham	2 Apr 1838	Landed Proprietor	1812	Born at North Walsham. Owned much land in Ridlington and Crostwight and was Lord of the Manor. Wife Anna Maria. Lived at the Hall in Crostwight and at North Walsham- Market Street in 1851 & 1861 (not found 1841). Died 1867.
Millard, Philip	North Walsham	29 Mar 1841	Solicitor	1785	Wife Virtue. 1841 - Market Place. Also Insurance Agent (Phoenix Fire & Pelican Life).
Le Neve, William	North Walsham	3 April 1837	Farmer	1797	Born at North Walsham. Lived at Tungate Farm - 218 acres employing 8 labourers. Wife Mary. Died 1862.
Harvey, John	North Walsham	3 April 1843	Farmer & lime burner	1809	Born at Ingham. Wife Elizabeth, born at Happisburgh. 1841 - Bradfield Bridge. 1851 - Bradfield Road. Farmer & lime burner with 192 acres, employing 10 labourers.
