Abraham, J.	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Kelling & district.
Aldham & Son	Solicitors. Boys Aldham b. 1776 Norwich, living in Kings Lynn 1851. Boys Robert Aldham, his son - not found 1851 (but listed in White's Directory 1845).
Allard, Francis	Constable & Parish Rate Collector, Gimingham. Poor rate & Highway rate. Carpenter b. 1796.
Allard, J.	Carter.
Allison, David Francis	Supplied trusses. Cutler & surgical instrument maker of Bethel Street, Norwich. Business premises in Upper Walk. Born 1815 approx., died 1847.
Allison, Esther	One of the Trunch inhabitants 'in the habit of gathering muck & placing it so near their dwellings or the dwellings of others as to be injurious to the health of the Occupiers of the said Houses' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Allison, J.D.	Cutler of Market Place, Norwich. Supplied trusses. Not found in any census or directory.
Amies, Abraham	Of North Walsham. Ratepayer. See 21 Jan 1839. Journeyman harness-maker.
Amies, J.	Supplied lime to Beckham workhouse.
Amies, Matthew	Of North Walsham. Ratepayer. See 21 Jan 1839. Ag. Lab. Of Reeves Lane.
Amies/Ames, William	Master Bricklayer of Roughton; b. 1797 at Thorpe Market. Limewashed both Workhouses.
Ampleford, Thomas	Supplied bricks. 1841 Census - Brick maker of Edingthorpe age 35. Doesn't appear in 1836 and 1845 directories.
Andrews, C.	A Norwich shopkeeper who acted an 'agent' for payment of relief to Union paupers living there.
Anthony, E.	Supplied butter to Sheringham Workhouse. Could be Elizabeth Anthony b. 1811 of Sheringham; wife of Fisherman Joshua Anthony.
Anthony, M.	Supplied milk and butter to Sheringham Workhouse.
Arden, Reverend F.E.	Of Gresham. Held a local stock of medicine for Cholera during the 1849 outbreak.
Arthur, Matthew	Supplied wine to Gimingham Workhouse. Census 1851 - King's Arms, North Walsham. Matthew Arthur - Inn Keeper age 49 b. Stanhoe. Wife Sophia age 43 b. Aylmerton.
Ashwell, Edward	Butcher of North Walsham. Supplied meat to both Workhouses. Not found in Census records or Directories.
Astley, F.	See Minutes of 13 Mar 1837.
Atkins, William B.	Farmer of Coston. Valued Parishes of Baconsthorpe, Barningham Winter, Holt (with Thomas Edwards), Plumstead & Matlask.
Bacon & Co.	Bacon & Kinnebrook, Printers of Norwich. Printed The <i>Norwich Mercury</i> . Submitted bills for advertising and books.
Bacon & Kinnebrook	See above.
Bacon, Nicholas C.	Surgeon of North Walsham. "A member of the Royal College of Surgeons & a member of the Apothecaries Company residing at North Walsham, is a general practitioner of medicine." Also an insurance agent for Crown Life. 1841 Census - Market Place, North Walsham. Nicholas age 29, surgeon, and wife Anne age 29.
Bailey (Widow)	Of North Walsham. Ratepayer. See 21 Jan 1839. Not identified.
Baker	Supplier of 'bed furniture & c.' Perhaps John of Holt, below.
Baker	Supplier of clothing. Probably Robert below.
Baker, C.	Ironmonger.
Baker, J.C.	Ironmonger.
Baker & Sewell	Carried out a valuation of workhouse articles. Probably the John Baker below.
Baker, George	Baker of Overstrand. Bread contractor.
Baker, James	Shoemaker of Southrepps. 1851 Census - Upper Street, Southrepps. Widowed Master 'Cordwinder' age 54 b. Southrepps. Son Moses (age 23) journeyman, same trade.
Baker, John	Ironmonger of Market Place, Holt. Presumably part of 'J&C Baker' of Holt in the 1845 White's Directory.
Baker, John	Of North Walsham. Advisor re rental charge of ex-Gilbert Union workhouses + value of the Parishes of Runton, Roughton, North Walsham, Felbrigg, Gresham, Aylmerton, Metton, Trimmingham, Alborough, Mundesley, Barningham Northwood & Overstrand.
Baker, John	Painter & glazier of Southrepps. Payment made to his Executors 2 Jul 1849 (died in Sep quarter of 1848).
Baker, Robert	Supplier of grocery, potatoes. Grocer & draper of North Walsham and Southrepps.
Baker, Robert	Bank agent. 1851 - Census - Yarmouth Road, North Walsham. Bank agent age 78 b. Southrepps. Wife Mary age 70 b. Happisburgh.
Baker, Robert Summers	Insurance agent for both Workhouses. Bank Manager & Attorney of Norwich Road, North Walsham. Agent to Messrs. Gurney & Co. 1851 Census - Solicitor age 35 b. North Walsham. Wife Laura E. Agte 32 b. Worstead.
Ballachey, George Baker & Son	Lawyers. Son was also G.B. See list of Guardians.
Balls, John	Flour Contractor for North Walsham District and workhouses at Gimingham and North Walsham. Probably John Balls, Miller of Bridge Gate, Worstead. No candidate found in the Union itself.
Balls, John	Of North Walsham. Ratepayer. See 21 Jan 1839. The only John Balls in 1841 was an Ag Lab of White Horse Lane.
Bane, George	Master Tailor of Lower Street, Southrepps. Appointed to assist Gimingham Governor as Constable (1838). Assistant Overseer of Cromer. Stand-in for the Governor and the Porter at other times. Born Thorpe Market 1776.
Bane, Richard	Tailor of Upper Street, Southrepps. Also acted as Letter Carrier & claimed postal charges.
Bane, Thomas	Supplier of shoes to Gimingham Workhouse. Shoemaker of Lower Street, Southrepps.
Banham, Richard	Small bill submitted against the Establishment account (Workhouse NK). Police Constable of Upper Street, Southrepps.
Banham, William	Valued the Parish of Trimmingham. Closest possibility seems to be a farm bailiff of Sculthorpe.
Bangay, M.	Bill submitted against the Sheringham Workhouse Establishment account. No M----- found. A few candidates: Richard, Blacksmith of Hunworth Richard, Blacksmith of Thornage Thomas, Blacksmith of Thornage John, Cooper of Holt
Barber	Of Bradfield. Paid for maintenance of a person named Webster. Could be John or Robert - see minutes of 8 Jan 1849.
Barber, George	Of Southrepps. Supplied potatoes to Gimingham Workhouse.
Barber, James	'Tailor of Trunch'. Born 1822 at Trunch. He was there in 1841, but moved to London approx 1845 and was living in Gloucester Street with his wife Eliza and son Edward at the time of the 1851 Census.
Barber, R.	Tailor. No candidate found.
Barber, R.	Supplied a small quantity of oatmeal 1845.
Barber, Robert	Submitted bills for dwelling & brushes. Grocer of Upper Street, Southrepps. 1841 Census - Upper Street. Shopkeeper age 20, living with 2 year-old Clarissa & servant Mary/May Moy. Widowed perhaps?
Barber, Robert	Builder, contracted to alter/repair Sheringham workhouse in 1836. Also did work at Gimingham.
Barcham, Benjamin	Supplier of coal to Sheringham workhouse. Auctioneer, ship owner and coal merchant of Lower Sheringham. Died 1839.
Barcham W.	Of Southrepps. Held a local stock of medicine for Cholera during the 1849 outbreak.
Barcham, William	Auctioneer of Mundesley. Churchwarden. Valued the Parishes of North Walsham, Roughton, Southrepps, Northrepps, Knapton, Hanworth, Alborough, Sidstrand, Trimmingham, Sheringham, Runton. Farmer and Land Agent b. 1772 at Great Yarmouth. His son-in-Law Robert Lacey was a coal merchant.
Barcham, William	Supplied coal to Sheringham workhouse. Merchant, maltster & farmer of Lower Sheringham. Born 1784 at Sheringham. Wife Catherine.
Barclay, Bevan & Co.	Bankers of London.
Bardwell J.	Supplied Groceries - possible error 25 Mar 1850.
Bardwell, S.	Supplied Groceries - possible error 4 Feb 1850, 11 Mar 1850.
Bardwell, William	Grocer of Norwich. Not found in 1851 Census.
Barker, J.	Glazier.
Barnard & Joy, Messrs.	Ironmongers and toolmakers of Upper Walk, Norwich. Provided a mangle for Gimingham Workhouse. C. Barnard.

Barnard, John	Clerk of the Tunstead & Happing Union. Perhaps the schoolmaster of Worstead (White's 1836)?
Barnes, Winter & Bernard	Lawyers involved in arranging the Beckham Workhouse building loan. Solicitors of 2 Great Winchester Street, London.
Barnes, E.	Cooper.
Barnes, William L. (Reverend)	Clerk of North Walsham. See 22 & 29 Mar 1841. Rector of Knapton.
Barton, Reverend H.M.	Of Metton. Held a local stock of medicine for Cholera during the 1849 outbreak.
Bartram, James	Churchwarden of Metton. Farmer. Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Metton.
Bassingthwaight(e), William	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Hunworth. Farmer born 1800 at Tuttington. 1851 - 129 acres with 5 labourers.
Bautler, Thomas	Valued & surveyed the Parish of Hunworth.
Bayfield, John F.	Accountant of King Street, Norwich. See Minutes 1 Feb 1847. Born 1802 at Norwich.
Bayliss, T.	Supplied Yorkshire stone.
Bean, G.	Submitted bill for clothing. Probably George BANE (above).
Beane, Benjamin	Relieving Officer of the Tunstead & Happing Union. Of Long Street, Tunstead.
Beare	Bill submitted against the Gimingham Workhouse Establishment account. Candidates: Linas Beare, shoemaker of North Walsham. Edmund Beare, farmer of Paston & Gimingham.
Beaumont, Isaac	Unsuccessful candidate for Porter May 1838 & Sep 1842. Several candidates in Suffolk.
Beaumont, Sarah	Unsuccessful candidate for Schoolmistress 23 Feb 1846. Possibly the daughter of Edmund Beaumont, shipwright of North Quay, Great Yarmouth.
Beck	Bills submitted against the Sheringham Workhouse clothing account.
Beck, John	Valued Parishes of Letheringsett, Weybourne. 1841 - Farmer of Reed Hall, Congham 1841. 1851 - Congham. Farmer of 1950 acres, employing 26 men.
Beck, William	Farmer of Mileham. Valued the Parishes of Cley, Thornage, Weybourne, Letheringsett. 1841 - Granstein Farm, Mileham. A bill for horse hire & expenses attending an appeal Holt Petty Sessions was submitted for 'Wm. & J. Beck' (20 Mar 1843).
Beckett, G.A.	An official employed by the Poor Law Board.
Beckwith (Mr.)	Surveyor of Taxes.
Bedford, T.	Bill submitted against Gimingham Establishment account.
Benn(s), William	Supplier of shoes to Gimingham House. Shoemaker of Church Street, Trunch. 'Accumulation of filth' in his yard (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Bidwell, Henry	Surgeon of Norwich Road, North Walsham.
Bidwell, Thomas	Farmer of Swafield. Accused Dr. E.A. Lane of non-attendance on the poor of Trunch.
Bird, E.	Supplied earthenware. Could be Elizabeth, daughter of Workhouse Governor Samuel Bird.
Bird, John	Baker of Trunch.
Bird, Samuel	Governor of Sheringham Workhouse. Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Sheringham.
Bird, William	Innkeeper of Great Yarmouth. Stood security for Samuel Bird as Governor of Sheringham Workhouse. Kept the Royal Hotel 1840-1854 and was declared bankrupt as a wine & spirit merchant a few years later.
Birkbeck, Henry	Banker of Norwich. Stood as surety for J.H. Gurney. 1841 - Keswick Parish, Intwood.
Birt, E.	Supplied earthenware.
Birt, Joseph	Supplied earthenware. Joseph Flower Birt appears in White's directory of 1845 as Collector of Taxes and China Dealer of Market Place, North Walsham.
Birt, Sarah	Supplied earthenware. Mother & daughter Martha (60) & Sarah (22) were china dealers of Market Place North Walsham in 1851.
Blade	Constable of Holt. Could be Charles (farmer), Jeremiah (butcher), John (ironmonger), William (journeyman butcher) or Robert (baker)!
Blade	Butcher of Holt. Probably Jeremiah.
Blake, Mr.	JP of Swafield. Robert Blake, later Robert Blake-Humfrey?
Blake, Keith & Blake	Solicitors of Norwich. Francis J. Blake of King Street, Solicitor. John J. Blake of Palace Street, Attorney & Solicitor. Thomas M. Keith of Bracondale, Lakenham, Solicitor.
Blake, Edward	Treasurer of Aylsham Union. See 20 Oct 1845.
Blake, Francis John	Treasurer of the County Asylum. Appears as 'Mr. Fras. John Blake, clerk and treasurer' in White's 1845 Directory. Attorney of King Street, Norwich.
Blakelock, Reverend Ralph	Rector of Gimingham; lived in Church Street. Rented land belonging to Gimingham Workhouse. Held a local stock of medicine for Cholera during the 1849 outbreak.
Bleakley, R. & P.	Of Oxnead. Robert and Page Bleakley were duffield, blanket &c. manufacturers of Oxnead Mill and Norwich.
Blogg, Joshua	Farmer of Upper Sheringham. Billed for carting wood (Sheringham). Overseer.
Blogg, W.	Supplied potatoes to Sheringham Workhouse. Perhaps William (below) selling his father's produce?
Blogg, William	Shoemaker son of Joshua above. Bill submitted against the Gimingham Workhouse clothing account.
Bloom, Atcherson	One of the Trunch inhabitants 'in the habit of gathering muck & placing it so near their dwellings or the dwellings of others as to be injurious to the health of the Occupiers of the said Houses' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Bloomfield, J.	Supplied potatoes to Sheringham Workhouse. Probably Joseph, the son of William, below.
Bloomfield, William	Farmer of Sheringham b. 1790. Supplied potatoes & carting services to Sheringham Workhouse. Overseer of Sheringham. Collected the Poor Rate.
Bloy, J.	Supplied flour in December 1846 when there was no main Contractor. There was a Bloy family bakery in Holt.
Blyth	Bills submitted against the Sheringham Workhouse clothing account.
Blyth, Dennis/Denis	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Sidestrand. Farmer.
Blyth, Samuel Harvey	Bookseller and chemist of Market Place, North Walsham. Unsuccessful candidate on 11 Nov 1844 for the post of Registrar for the North Walsham District of the Union. 1851 Census - Chemist & druggist age 48 b. North Creake. Wife Mary age 48 b. Holme Hale.
Boardman, Thomas	His trustees supplied 'white pease' to Beckham workhouse.
Bolding, John	See his Guardian entry.
Bond, C.	Supplied a small quantity of potatoes 1851.
Bond, Reverend Robert A.B.	Curate of Briston.
Bond, W.	Supplied a small quantity of potatoes 1851.
Bone, John	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Alborough. Grocer and draper.
Bone, R.	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Plumstead.
Bonus - see Carter & Bonus	
Booth, Edward	Unsuccessful candidate for Relieving Officer 1842. Plumber of Hanworth.
Boughay, Charles	Hotel & Inn-keeper of Mundesley, b. 1786. Supplier of Wine & Porter to Gimingham Workhouse.
Boughton	Supplied wine & Porter to Gimingham Workhouse.
Boulter, Thomas	Farmer & auctioneer of Aylsham Road, Oulton. Surveyed & valued the Parish of Hunworth (with Joseph Manning).
Boulter, Thomas	One of the Trunch inhabitants 'in the habit of gathering muck & placing it so near their dwellings or the dwellings of others as to be injurious to the health of the Occupiers of the said Houses' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Bowles, John S.	City Missionary of Thorpe Hamlet.
Bowyer, Henry George	Her Majesty's Inspector of Schools. Born on 3 January 1813, the son of Sir George Bowyer, 2nd/6th Bt. and Anne Hammond Douglas. He married Katherine Emma Sandby, daughter of Reverend George Sandby, on 20 February 1855.2 He died on 25 September 1883 at age 70.
Boyce, James	Unsuccessful candidate for Gimingham Porter 27 Mar 1837.
Boyd, Alexander & Thomas	Millers of Holt. Appear in 1851 on Norwich Road as Landed Proprietors, with Alexander additionally farming 636 acres with 20 men, 7 women & 6 lads. Both born at Pinner; Alexander in 1818 and Thomas in 1823.
Brackenbury/Brakenbury, Matthew	Butcher of Market Place, North Walsham. Ratepayer. See 21 Jan 1839.
Brackenbury/Brakenbury, William	Of Trunch. Unsuccessful candidate for the position of Porter at the Gimingham Workhouse in 1848.
Bradfield/Bradford, Thomas	Supplier of potatoes. Farmer of North Walsham and operator of a Norwich coach.
Brady (Mrs.)	Of Norwich. See Minutes 19 Feb 1849.

Brady, H.	Dr. Coleby's assistant. He pp'd a medical certificate on behalf of John Coleby.
Breeze, D.	Unsuccessful candidate for Porter 30 Jul 1838. Candidates: Daniel, shoemaker of Ingham. Daniel, carpenter of Sutton. Daniel, silk weaver of Lambert's Yard, Norwich St. Martin at Palace.
Breeze/Breese, John	Baker of High Street, Cromer. Supplier of bread to Gimmingham initially, then to both Workhouses.
Breeze/Breese, Robert	Butcher of Lower Sheringham and later Bodham. Supplied meat and suet to Workhouses.
Brock, John	Of Caistor. Unsuccessful candidate for the position of Porter at the Gimmingham Workhouse in 1848. Revenue Officer and Clerk b. 1785.
Brook	With William Atkins, valued the Parish of Plumstead. Several Candidates!
Brooks, M.	Bill submitted against Sheringham In-maintenance account. Perhaps Matthew, below.
Brooks, Matthew	Bill submitted against Gimmingham Establishment account. Coal Heaver of East Street, Cromer.
Broughton, Mark	Supplied potatoes to Sheringham Workhouse. 1851 - Pensioner & Ag Lab of East Beckham b. 1785 at West Beckham.
Brown	Carting &c. at Gimmingham Workhouse. Perhaps Edward Brown, farmer of Sustead?
Brown, George	Baker of Overstrand. Bread and flour contractor. His business was transferred to trustees in September 1851 (see Minutes for 13 Oct 1851). Insolvent? George reappeared some years later as a railway clerk in London.
Brown, J.	Unsuccessful candidate for Governor of Sheringham Workhouse 1840. Several John/James Browns in the area.
Brown, T.	Bill submitted against the Sheringham Establishment account. Nearest candidate is Thomas Brown, brewer of Cromer.
Brown, Reverend T.	Of Suffield. Held a local stock of medicine for Cholera during the 1849 outbreak.
Brown, Thomas	Supplied lime and small quantities of potatoes to Gimmingham Workhouse. Farmer & flax dealer of Trimmingham (see Guardians). Also stood security for builder Thomas Hall's contract to make alterations at Gimmingham Workhouse.
Buck, Benjamin	Resident of Trunch.
Buck, Miles	Builder of Skeyton. 1841 - Skeyton. Carpenter age 20. 1845 - Skeyton. Joiner & grocer (White's). 1851 - Skeyton. Master Carpenter employing 3 men & 1 apprentice.
Buck, Richard	Stood as surety for building work done by Miles Buck - his father perhaps. 1836 - Wheelwright of Skeyton (White's). 1841 - Carpenter of Skeyton age 55. 1845 - Wheelwright of Skeyton (White's). 1851 - Master Carpenter of Skeyton age 68 employing 10 men.
Buck, Thomas	Stood as surety for building work done by Miles Buck. 1841 - Farmer of Swanton Abbott, age 65. 1851 - Swanton Abbott. Farmer of 8 Acres age 75. Born Skeyton.
Bullen	Carpenter. Either James Bullen of Trimmingham, Samuel Bullen of Trunch or wheelwright James Bullen of Gimmingham.
Bullen, Martha	Applied for position of nurse but was considered unsuitable (Minutes 25 Oct 1847). Probably the Martha Bullen who appears in the list of Paupers (separate document).
Bullen, Samuel	Of Trunch. Pig sty 'injurious to health' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Bullen, William	Painter & glazier of Market Place, Holt. 1851 - age 34, Master Painter employing 1 man. Born at Holt. Wife Ann age 32 born Beeston.
Buller, Charles (Esq.)	Poor Law Commissioner for England, appointed December 1847.
Bulley, Buckenham	Of Trunch. Had an uncovered cesspool (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Bunn, William	Distributed voting papers in 1841. A bill sticker of the Butchery, North Walsham. Constable?
Bunnnett, S.	Glazier.
Bunting/Bunton, John	Of Gimmingham. Paid for pig swill ('hog wash') from Gimmingham Workhouse. Ag Lab b. 1792 at Southrepps.
Bunting/Bunton, N.	Supplied flour in December 1846 when there was no main Contractor. Could be Norton Bunting, grocer of South Creake.
Burcham, George	Of Holt. Valued the Parish of Edqefield. Land Surveyor of Chapel Street in 1836 (White's) but not found 1841.
Burges, T.	Supplied Hay & Straw.
Burrell, E.	Cooper.
Burrell, Edward	Basketmaker of Market Place, Holt. Born 1802 at Hunworh.
Burrell, J.	Basketmaker. Not identified.
Burrell, W.	Basketmaker. Not identified.
Burton	Of Contractors 'Burton & Fre(e)man.' Several candidates, including: John, bricklayer of Beeston Regis. Benjamin, carpenter of Trunch. Francis, bricklayer of Southrepps.
Burton	Of Contractors 'Burton & Francis/Frances' - carpenters. Probably Benjamin, above.
Burton, James	Overseer of Hanworh.
Burton, John	Butcher of Market Place, North Walsham. Supplied meat to both Workhouses.
Burton, Sewell	Baker of Jetty Street, Cromer. Supplied bread to workhouses and flour to distribution stations.
Burton, William	Labourer. Not identified.
Butcher, Mr.	Umpire in determination of Workhouse rents. Henry Butcher, farmer of North Walsham.
Buttle, Maria	One of the Trunch inhabitants 'in the habit of gathering muck & placing it so near their dwellings or the dwellings of others as to be injurious to the health of the Occupiers of the said Houses' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Cable, Robert	Assisted Clerk by receiving nomination papers (for Guardian) for Aylmerton. Shoemaker.
Calvert, Reverend Thomas	Minister of St. James Parish, Norwich.
Cannell (Mr.)	Overseer of Bodham.
Cannon, Robert	Clerk in the Times office; b. 1794, living at 23 Lloyd Square, Clerkenwell in 1851.
Carige, J.H.	Made a loan of £500 in 1779 to the Parish of Holt in conjunction with another person whose name is illegible. See 25 Jan 1841. A John Herbert Carige (his Son?) appears in 1851 and 1861 at Salutory Mount, Heavitree, Devon. John H. Carige, late Lt. 12th Foot, born 1798 Caiorapore, East Indies (perhaps Khairpur). Died 2 Aug 1862, effects under £4000.
Carrick, Margaret	Resident of Trunch. Her dwelling considered to be 'in a filthy & Unwholesome state' (Minutes 5 Feb 1849).
Carter	Ironwork at Sheringham Workhouse. Not identified.
Carter & Bonus	Emigration Agents. Carter & Bonus were situated at No. 11 Leadenhall Street, London, the premises of the British East India Company, and were one of the largest carriers of emigrants to North America in the 1830s & 1840s. John Bonus (1795-1865); contractor as a government emigration agent and partner with Robert Carter (? - 1878). Bonus was of Italian origins.
Carter, Henry	Resident of Australia - see 29 Apr 1844.
Carter, J.	Glazier.
Carter, J.	Supplied straw. Probably James Carter, farmer of Lower Street, Southrepps. See list of Guardians.
Carter, M.	Glazier (Sheringham Workhouse). Could be Mary - wife of Stephen below.
Carter, Stephen	Painter & Glazier of Upper Sheringham b.1807. Employed at both Workhouses.
Carter, Thomas	Resident of Australia - see 29 Apr 1844.
